Dear Mr Farquhar:

While participating in an operational flight over Saint Valentin, Austria on October 16, 1944, the Liberator aboard which your son, First Lieutenant Raymond J. Farquhar, Junior, 0708805, served as navigator was severely damaged as a result of the anti-aircraft fire which the attacking formation encountered over the target. Ray's plane lost altitude rapidly but before it passed from view in the clouds two parachutes were seen to emerge. No further word of the ship or its crew has been received but you may be assured that the War Department will notify you as soon as additional information becomes available.

Your son's personal possessions have been sent to the Effects Quartermaster at Kansas City, Missouri and from that point they will be forwarded to you.

As a symbol of the high regard in which Ray's accomplishments are held, he has been awarded the Air Medal with two Oak Leaf Clusters. On behalf of his many friends, among whom he has won an enviable position of respect and esteem, I extend earnest hopes for his safety.

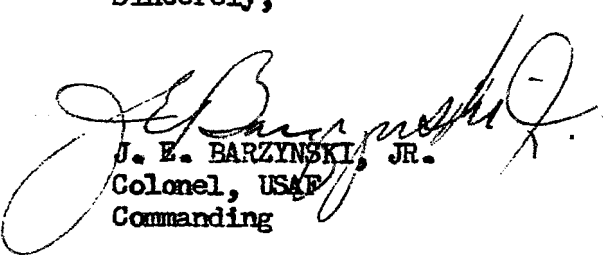
